Introduction

This toolkit helps Best Start in Life partners share the Steps for School social media campaign, with content designed to reach families across England whose children will be starting Reception.

We know that preparing for school is a journey, and small everyday moments at home can help children build confidence, communication and independence over time.

Here you'll find key messages, suggested framing, and ready-to-use content to support consistent, positive conversations across social media channels.



About the campaign

The Steps for School campaign is part of the Government's Best Start in Life programme, supporting parents and carers in the early years, from pregnancy through to starting school.

The campaign supports parents and carers with practical advice and tips on skills they can practise at home with their children, to help create strong foundations for a confident start to school.

Best Start in Life offers clear, trusted advice for families, helping them understand how everyday moments support children's development and the skills they need for school. It offers simple steps parents can build into daily routines at home:

- Communication and language skills
- Social and emotional development
- Independence skills

Families will be signposted to Best Start in Life for clear, practical and trusted information.



Key messaging

WHY THIS CAMPAIGN IS IMPORTANT

Parents and carers can feel uncertain about what 'preparing for school' involves and unsure where to turn for trusted advice and support. That's why it's important to share clear messages using a simple structure: advice, reassurance, and support.

ADVICE

- Helping children feel prepared for school is a team effort. What parents do at home, alongside childcare and early years education, can make a big difference.
- Everyday moments like chatting and communicating, reading, playing and practising independence can help children grow. Small steps and simple routines build strong foundations over time.
- Introducing and practising skills such as using the toilet, taking turns and following instructions helps children settle into new routines.
- You are your child's first teacher. Talking about daily activities and helping children recognise and name emotions supports communication and relationships.



Key messaging

REASSURANCE

- Getting prepared for school isn't about a checklist - it's about the small, everyday moments that help children grow.
- Every child develops at different rates, and every family's circumstances are different, so go at your own pace.
- You're probably already doing many of the things that help your child prepare for school - and there's no need to do everything at once.



SUPPORT

Community management

As Steps for School content is shared, you may receive questions or comments from parents and carers. Community management should be handled in a supportive, reassuring and non-judgemental way.

WHEN RESPONDING

- Keep language warm, calm and encouraging, and avoid using directive or instructional wording.
- Reassure parents and carers that every child develops at their own pace and in different ways, and that there is no single 'right' way to prepare for school.
- Focus on confidence-building and practical reassurance, rather than instruction or correction.
- Where helpful, signpost families to Best Start in Life for trusted, government-approved information and support.



PLEASE AVOID

- Offering individualised advice beyond the scope of campaign messaging.
- Comparing children or suggesting that families are 'behind' or 'not ready'.
- Engaging in debate or responding to critical comments in a defensive way.
- If comments raise safeguarding concerns or require specialist support, follow your organisation's usual escalation and moderation processes.

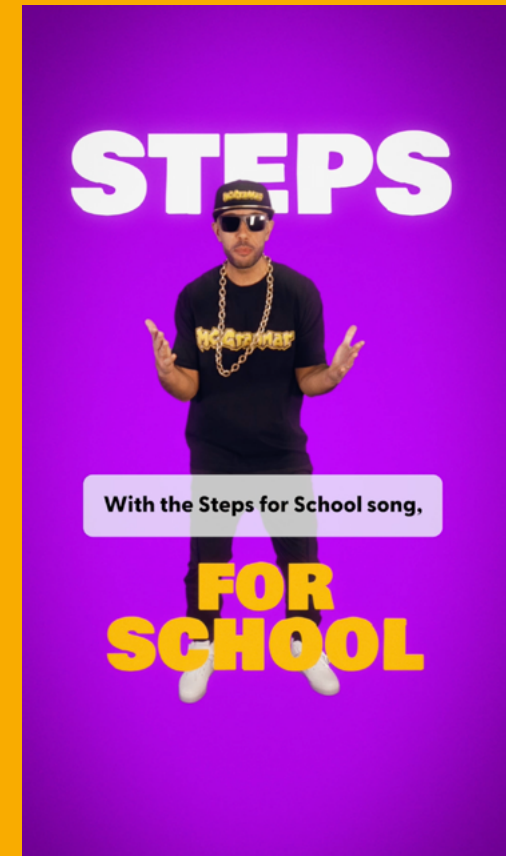

This carousel forms part of the same advertising suite and will be used specifically on TikTok to reach parents.

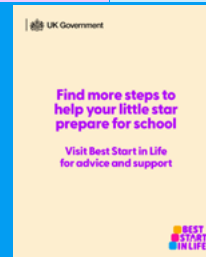
